ORDINANCE #19-13**

BOND ORDINANCE TO AUTHORIZE THE MAKING OF VARIOUS PUBLIC IMPROVEMENTS AND THE ACQUISITION OF NEW ADDITIONAL OR REPLACEMENT EQUIPMENT AND MACHINERY, NEW INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY EQUIPMENT, NEW COMMUNICATION AND SIGNAL SYSTEMS EQUIPMENT, AND NEW FIRE TRUCKS AND NEW AUTOMOTIVE VEHICLES, INCLUDING ORIGINAL APPARATUS AND EQUIPMENT, IN, BY AND FOR THE BOROUGH OF RIVER EDGE, IN THE COUNTY OF BERGEN, STATE OF NEW JERSEY, TO APPROPRIATE THE SUM OF \$1,787,395 TO PAY THE COST THEREOF, TO MAKE A DOWN PAYMENT, TO AUTHORIZE THE ISSUANCE OF BONDS TO FINANCE SUCH APPROPRIATION AND TO PROVIDE FOR THE ISSUANCE OF BOND ANTICIPATION NOTES IN ANTICIPATION OF THE ISSUANCE OF SUCH BONDS.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Borough Council of the Borough of River Edge, in the County of Bergen, State of New Jersey, as follows:

Section 1. The Borough of River Edge, in the County of Bergen, State of New Jersey (the "Borough") is hereby authorized to make various public improvements and to acquire new additional or replacement equipment and machinery, new information technology equipment, new communication and signal systems equipment, and new fire trucks and new automotive vehicles, including original apparatus and equipment, in, by and for said Borough, as more particularly described in Section 4 hereof. Said improvements shall include all work, materials and appurtenances necessary and suitable therefor.

Section 2. There is hereby appropriated to the payment of the cost of making the improvements described in Sections 1 and 4 hereof (hereinafter referred to as "purposes"), the respective amounts of money hereinafter stated as the appropriation for said respective purposes. Said appropriation shall be met from the proceeds of the sale of the bonds authorized and the down payment appropriated by this ordinance. Said improvements shall be made as general improvements and no part of the cost thereof shall be assessed against property specially benefited.

Section 3. It is hereby determined and stated that the making of such improvements is not a current expense of said Borough.

Section 4. The several purposes hereby authorized for the financing of which said obligations are to be issued are set forth in the following "Schedule of Improvements, Purposes and Amounts" which schedule also shows (1) the amount of the appropriation and the estimated cost of each such purpose, and (2) the amount of each sum which is to be provided by the down payment hereinafter appropriated to finance such purposes, and (3) the estimated maximum amount of bonds and notes to be issued for each such purpose, and (4) the period of usefulness of each such purpose, according to its reasonable life, computed from the date of said bonds:

Section 5. The cost of such purposes, as hereinbefore stated, includes the aggregate amount of \$100,000 which is estimated to be necessary to finance the cost of such purposes, including architect's fees, accounting, engineering and inspection costs, legal expenses and other expenses, including interest on such obligations to the extent permitted by Section 20 of the Local Bond Law.

Section 6. It is hereby determined and stated that moneys exceeding \$90,104, appropriated for down payments on capital improvements or for the capital improvement fund in budgets heretofore adopted for said Borough, are now available to finance said purposes. The sum of \$90,104 is hereby appropriated from such moneys to the payment of the cost of said purposes.

Section 7. To finance said purposes, bonds of said Borough of an aggregate principal amount not exceeding \$1,697,291 are hereby authorized to be issued pursuant to the Local Bond Law. Said bonds shall bear interest at a rate per annum as may be hereafter determined within the limitations prescribed by law. All matters with respect to said bonds not determined by this ordinance shall be determined by resolutions to be hereafter adopted.

Section 8. To finance said purposes, bond anticipation notes of said Borough of an aggregate principal amount not exceeding \$1,697,291 are hereby authorized to be issued pursuant to the Local Bond Law in anticipation of the issuance of said bonds. In the event that bonds are issued pursuant to this ordinance, the aggregate amount of notes hereby authorized to be issued shall be reduced by an amount equal to the principal amount of the bonds so issued. If the aggregate amount of outstanding bonds and notes issued pursuant to this ordinance shall at any time exceed the sum first mentioned in this section, the moneys raised by the issuance of said bonds shall, to not less than the amount of such excess, be applied to the payment of such notes then outstanding.

Section 9. Each bond anticipation note issued pursuant to this ordinance shall be dated on or about the date of its issuance and shall be payable not more than one year from its date, shall bear interest at a rate per annum as may be hereafter determined within the limitations prescribed by law and may be renewed from time to time pursuant to and within limitations prescribed by the Local Bond Law. Each of said bond anticipation notes shall be signed by the Mayor and by a financial officer and shall be under the seal of said Borough and attested by the Borough Clerk or Deputy Borough Clerk. Said officers are hereby authorized to execute said notes in such form as they may adopt in conformity with law. The power to determine any matters with respect to said notes not determined by this ordinance and also the power to sell said notes, is hereby delegated to the Chief Financial Officer who is hereby authorized to sell said notes either at one time or from time to time in the manner provided by law.

Section 10. It is hereby determined and declared that the average period of usefulness of said purposes, according to their reasonable lives, taking into consideration the respective amounts of bonds or notes authorized for said purposes, is a period of 13.54 years computed from the date of said bonds.

Section 11. It is hereby determined and stated that the Supplemental Debt Statement required by the Local Bond Law has been duly made and filed in the office of the Borough Clerk of said Borough, and that such statement so filed shows that the gross debt of said Borough, as defined in Section 43 of the Local Bond Law, is increased by this ordinance by \$1,697,291 and that the issuance of the bonds and notes authorized by this ordinance will be within all debt limitations prescribed by said Local Bond Law.

Section 12. Any funds received from private parties, the County of Bergen, the State of New Jersey or any of their agencies or any funds received from the United States of America or any of its agencies in aid of such purposes, shall be applied to the payment of the cost of such purposes, or, if bond anticipation notes have been issued, to the payment of the bond anticipation notes, and the amount of bonds authorized for such purposes shall be reduced accordingly.

Section 13. The capital budget is hereby amended to conform with the provisions of this ordinance to the extent of any inconsistency therewith and the resolutions promulgated by the Local Finance Board showing full detail of the amended capital budget and capital program as approved by the Director, Division of Local Government Services, is on file with the Borough Clerk and is available for public inspection.

Section 14. The Borough intends to issue the bonds or notes to finance the cost of the improvements described in Sections 1 and 4 of this bond ordinance. If the Borough incurs such costs prior to the issuance of the bonds or notes, the Borough hereby states its reasonable expectation to reimburse itself for such expenditures with the proceeds of such bonds or notes in the maximum principal amount of bonds or notes authorized by this bond ordinance.

Section 15. The full faith and credit of the Borough are hereby pledged to the punctual payment of the principal of and the interest on the obligations authorized by this ordinance. Said obligations shall be direct, unlimited and general obligations of the Borough, and the Borough shall levy ad valorem taxes upon all the taxable real property within the Borough for the payment of the principal of and interest on such bonds and notes, without limitation as to rate or amount.

Section 16. This ordinance shall take effect twenty days after the first publication thereof after final passage.

A CAPITAL ORDINANCE OF THE BOROUGH OF RIVER EDGE, IN THE COUNTY OF BERGEN, STATE OF NEW JERSEY, AUTHORIZING THE RECONSTRUCTION OF COURTS IN VETERAN'S MEMORIAL PARK IN SAID BOROUGH AND APPROPRIATING THE SUM OF \$37,640.00 FROM BERGEN COUNTY'S 2018 OPEN SPACE, RECREATION, FLOODPLAIN PROTECTION, FARMLAND & HISTORIC PRESERVATION TRUST FUND

BE IT ORDAINED by the Borough Council of the Borough of River Edge in the County of Bergen, State of New Jersey as follows:

Section 1. The Borough of River Edge shall undertake the Reconstruction of Courts in Veteran's Memorial Park. Such improvements shall include all work and appurtenances necessary and suitable for the use and purpose thereof. Such improvements shall be made in accordance with plans to be prepared thereof by the Borough herein authorized to be made.

Section 2. The Borough shall expend \$37,640.00 for the \$37,640.00 improvement authorized in Section 1. hereof. Said sum of \$37,640.00 is a grant from the Bergen County 2018 Open Space, Recreation, Floodplain Protection, Farmland & Historic Preservation Trust Fund.

Section 3. Such improvement is hereby determined and declared to be a Capital Improvement, which the Borough may lawfully make pursuant to law.

Section 4. This ordinance shall take effect at the time and in the manner provided by law.

SITE PLAN/VARIANCE NOTICE

PLEASE TAKE NOTICE, that an application has been made by the Bergen County Historical Society for site plan and variance approval. A public hearing will be held before the Land Use Board of the Borough of River Edge, at the Municipal Building, 705 Kinderkamack Road, on May 1, 2019, at 7:30 p.m. or as soon thereafter as this matter can be reached, for site plan approval to construct an approximate 2,331 square foot building to house a museum and library. The Applicant is seeking a variance to permit the continuance of an existing non-conformity since a frame barn extends 2.4 feet over the property line. In addition, the Applicant, if necessary, requests a variance or waiver to provide the required off-street parking across Main Street on property not owned by them but which they are permitted to use. Also, for any other variances or waivers required, at premises commonly known as 1201-1209 Main Street, as to the building, and 488 Hackensack Avenue, as to the parking, and as Lot 2 in Block 1304, as to the building, and Lot 1 in Block 1305, as to the parking, on the current tax assessment map of the Borough of River Edge. Although Lot 2 in Block 1303 is technically a part of the Application, there are no improvements to be performed on those premises. If approved, the Applicant will be connecting its sanitary sewer to the sanitary sewer line located on the premises located at 1182 Main Street, River Edge, and known as Lot 4 in Block 1306 on the Tax Assessment Map pursuant to an easement agreement.

You may appear at such time and place and be heard personally or through your attorney concerning said application. Should you desire any additional information, the file is available for your review at the Borough Hall Monday through Friday during the hours of 9:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m.

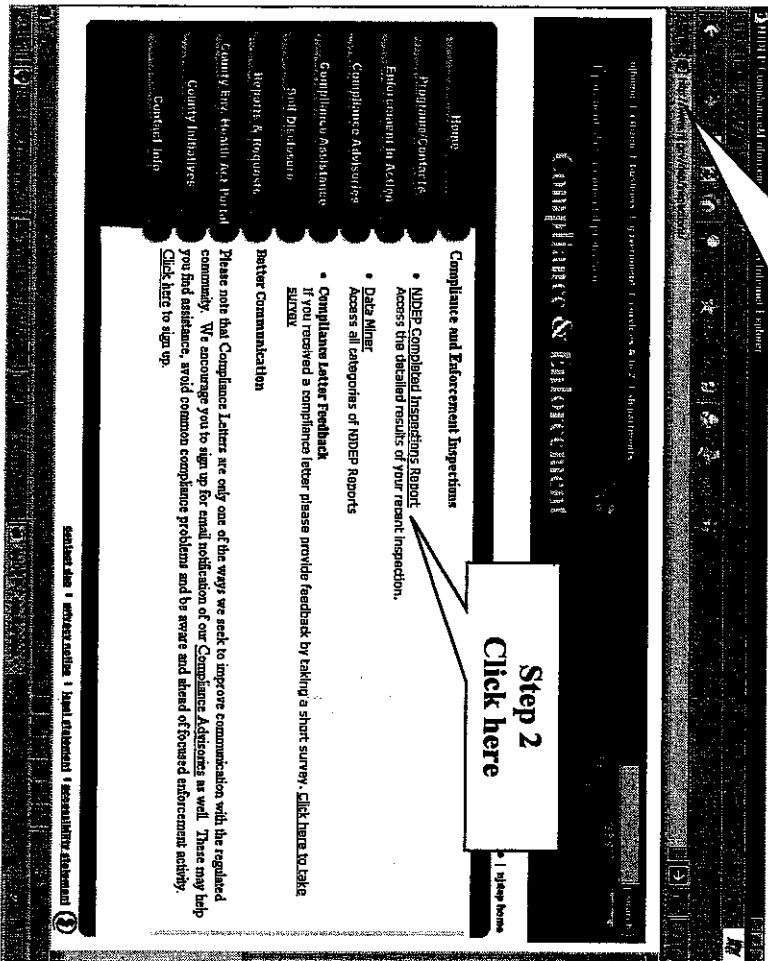

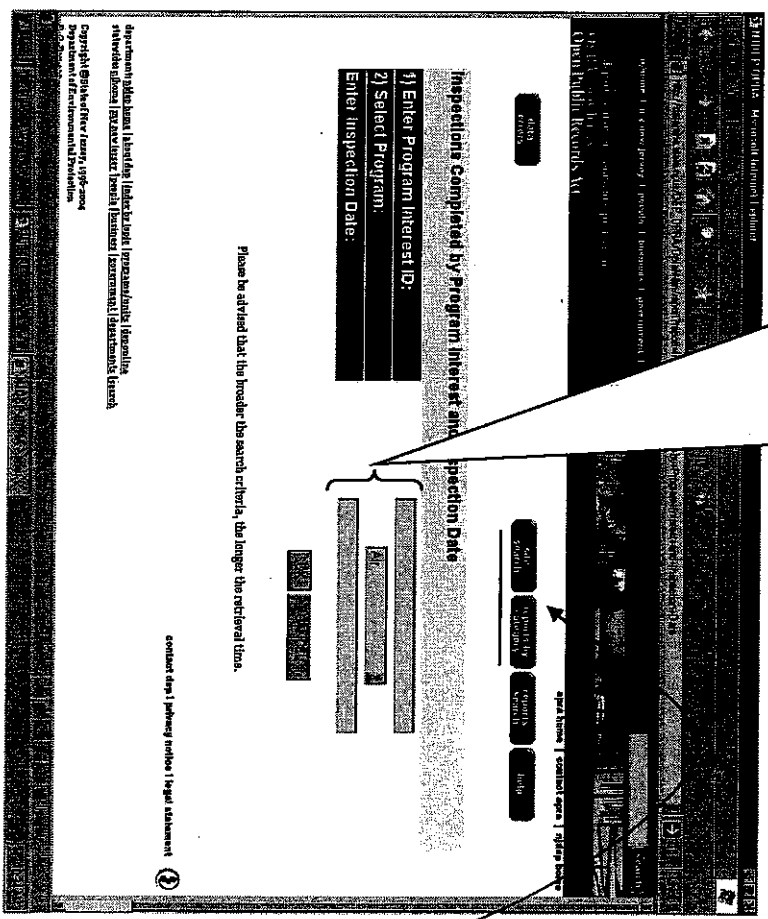

National Library Week

On April 8th I attended Mayor & Council with several Board members where we accepted a proclamation marking National Library Week. I was very happy to see that the proclamation included a reference to “transformative services, programs and expertise”.

Children's Service Desk

I am in the process of soliciting an updated quote for a children's service desk. Since this is an item that would improve ADA access we will try to include it in the larger construction project that the Borough is working on. The State of New Jersey has included ADA considerations in its construction bond program. The latest word from the State Library is: “We are corresponding and meeting with our liaisons in the Governor's Policy Office regularly.” I have reached out to Creative Library Concepts for a quote.

Bohemian Rhapsody

We organized a screening of the hit movie “Bohemian Rhapsody” on a Thursday evening as a sort of experiment. I felt that this was a film that might appeal more to the 9 to 5 population. We had 19 attendees.



Friends Help

The Friends have agreed to help us with the purchase of new blinds for the staff work area and lunch room, plus 3 new flat top book trucks. They have also offered to help fund new office desks and filing cabinets for the staff when the funds become available. The blinds have already been ordered and will be installed in May.

Retirement of Alan Negreann

I am attending the retirement dinner of Alan Negreann, Borough Administrator, next month. Alan has been with the Borough for more than 30 years and is an outstanding public servant.

Voice Over Internet Phones

The Borough is in the process of installing voice over internet phones. The hope is that the new phones will save money. The Library was not consulted before this was decided. Now we are presented with the problem that BCCLS will not allow the phones on its network, since they would interfere with the quality of the connection for other functions. I am working on this problem with the incoming Borough Administrator, Raymond Poerio.

Wifi Improvements

On April 23rd our networking guy, Dennis Hartigan, replaced a broken access point to our public wifi network. He also set up a new staff access point, complete with password, in the staff work room. This gives the staff access to the network in a part of the building where the signal was weak. Personally I really need this as often my impromptu training sessions with members of the public are held in my office.

Poetry Competition

On April 30th we hosted the 3rd Annual Poetry Awards Ceremony. About 70 students, parents, teachers and school officials attended. There were 240 entries in total. This year we were honored to have renowned poet Janet Wong present the awards. Janet gave a short talk about what poetry means to her, touching on her immigrant background and using cool toys. Each time a child received an award

she explained what she liked most about the poem. This made the ceremony extra special. The kids did a wonderful job of reading their poems. We had smiles, laughter, applause and many expressions of gratitude. The Friends provided the refreshments and a good time was had by all.



Shopping Cart Donation

A generous patron has offered to fund the purchase of 2 or 3 mini shopping carts. She has used them at another area library (Paramus) and feels our patrons, particularly those with mobility issues, could use them. Though there are several vendors who sell them I want to be sure we get the best quality carts that will last for many years.



The purpose of this meeting was to discuss the review letter, dated April 29, 2019 which was prepared by Mr. Ahmad. In addition, Mr. Ahmad discussed the procedures and steps to move forward with the overall project.

The following items were discussed for this project.

- Mr. Ahmad stated that the Borough cannot advertise the project until to the Department of Transportation obtains authorization from the Federal Highway Administration.
- NJDOT would like written assurance that Borough of Rive Edge will be prepared to advertise the project for bids within two months of our notice that Federal Funds are authorized.
- The Borough of River Edge may qualify for the construction inspection and oversite reimbursement up to 15% of the total construction cost. In addition, the Borough of River Edge is required to select the inspection firm in accordance with the Brooks Act.
- Mr. Ahmad explained that a public employ is responsible charge of the project. In addition, it also requires a certification to become a responsible charge. The training courses will be available at Rutgers CAIT training center.

- Mr. Ahmad stated that "Pay to Play" provisions are not acceptable for federally funded projects. Any references to "Pay to Play" will result in the project being ineligible for federal funds, and any funds already provided, being withdrawn.
- Mr. Ahmad wants the following items as separate pay items:
 - Tree Removal.
 - Replace in kind shrub.
 - Curb restoration.
 - Replace in kind pavers.
- Curb ramps must be constructed in strict conformance with the construction details and application ADA guidelines. Any existing ramps that are not compliant must be upgraded to meet current standard. Failure to comply with this requirement will likely result in the entire project being ineligible for NJDOT funding participation.
- The limit of disturbance exceeds the right of way line at number of locations. Mr. Ahmad needs a "Right of Entry" letter in Borough of River Edge letterhead before commencing the work within the private property.
- Mr. Ahmad will re-review the items 12,14,15,19,20,26,48 and 49 are in the plans.
- All Federally funded projects require a review for compliance with the Department's Civil Right Program. The ESBE/DBE (Disadvantaged Business Enterprise) and Trainee goals have not been obtained. They will be provided once they have been set and should be so noted on the proper attachment to the specification at that time.
- All items specified in any of the proposed documents must be exact quantities. Please remove the "If and Where Directed" from any pay item description.
- NJDOT will not participate in the cost of cellar door replacement.
- Mr. Ahmad stated that the Categorical Exclusion Documentation will be revised as per the changes reflected in the plans. Therefore, he is requesting a new revised scope of work.
- According to Title 23 CFR 635.105 requires project receive adequate supervision and detailed construction inspection to ensure construction is completed in conformance with the approved plans and specifications. Please identify the full-time construction inspection and oversight personal for this project.

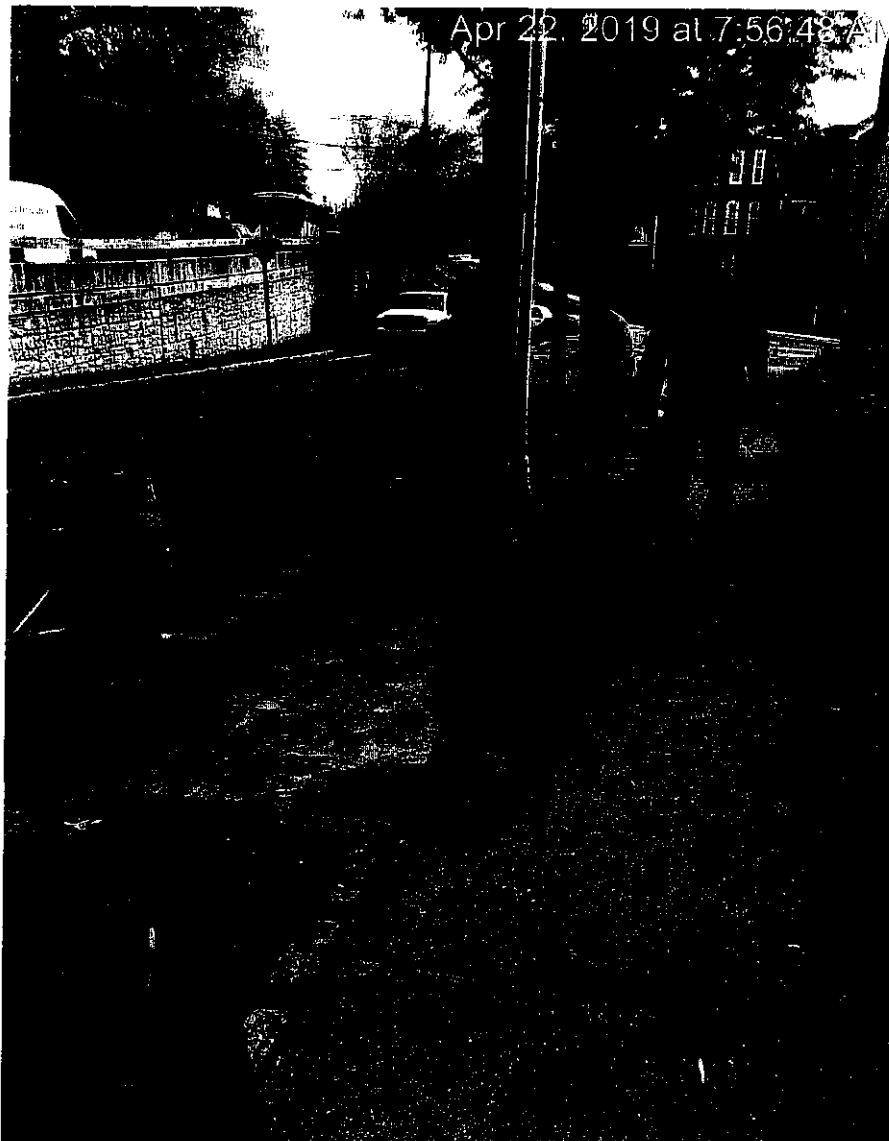

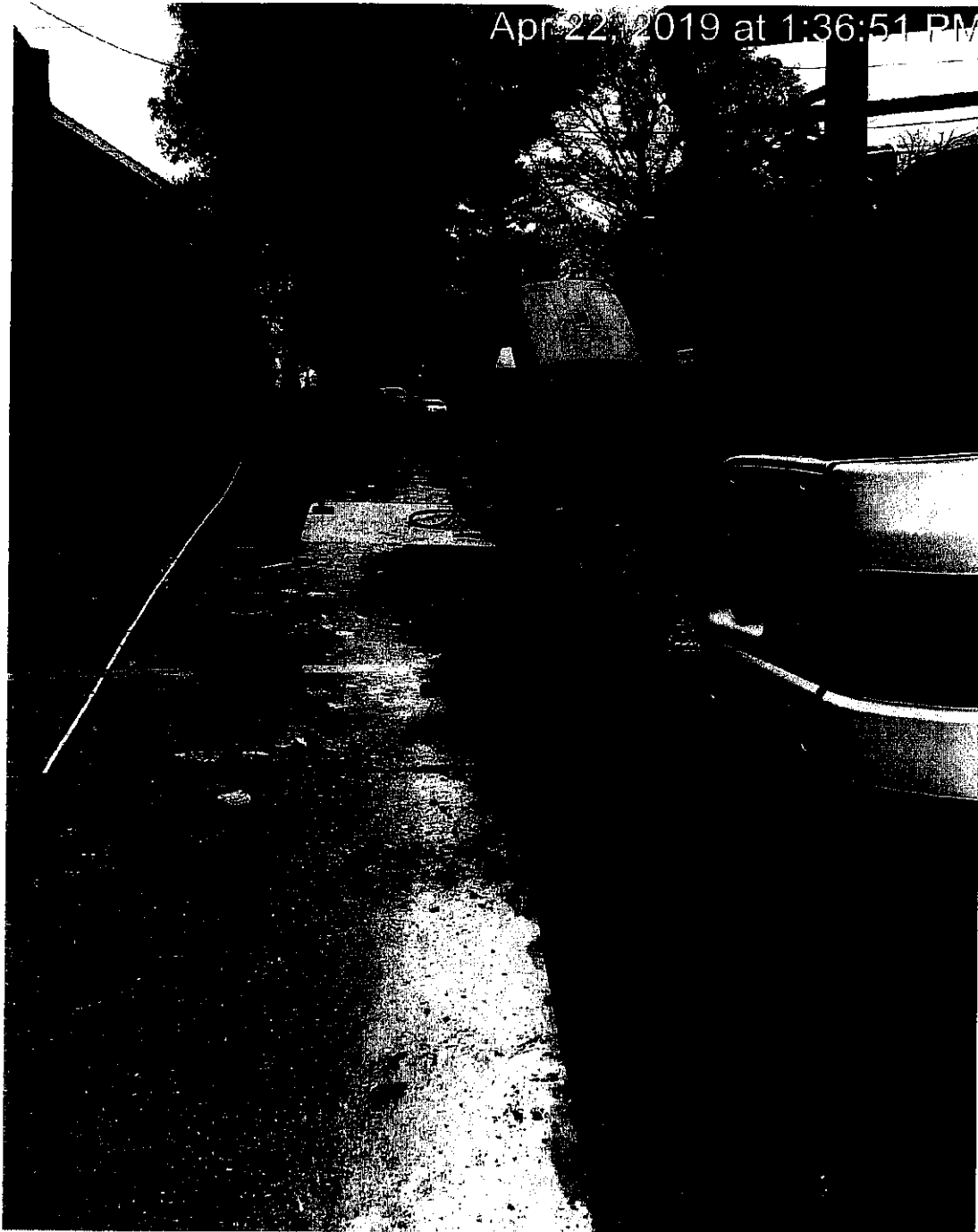

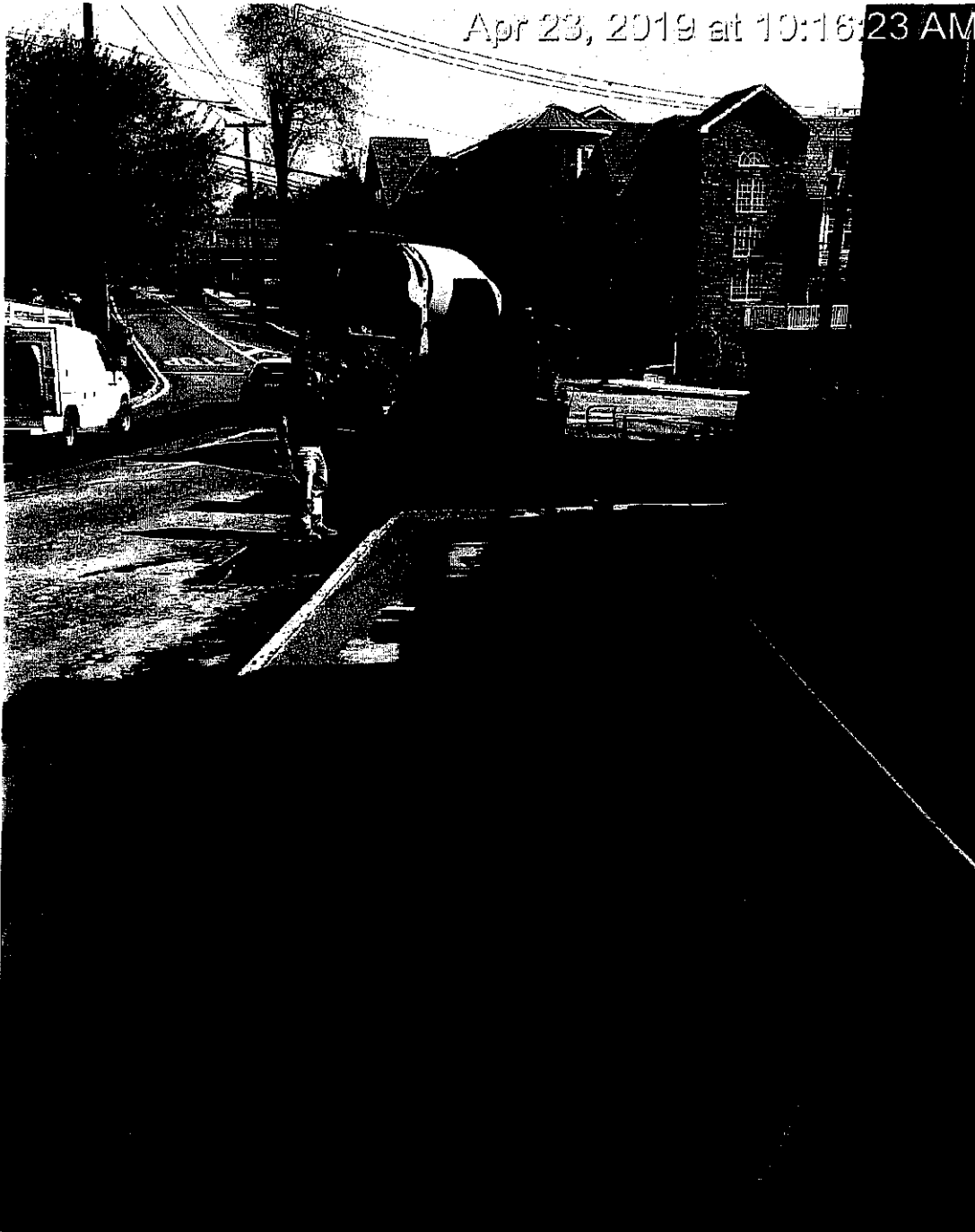

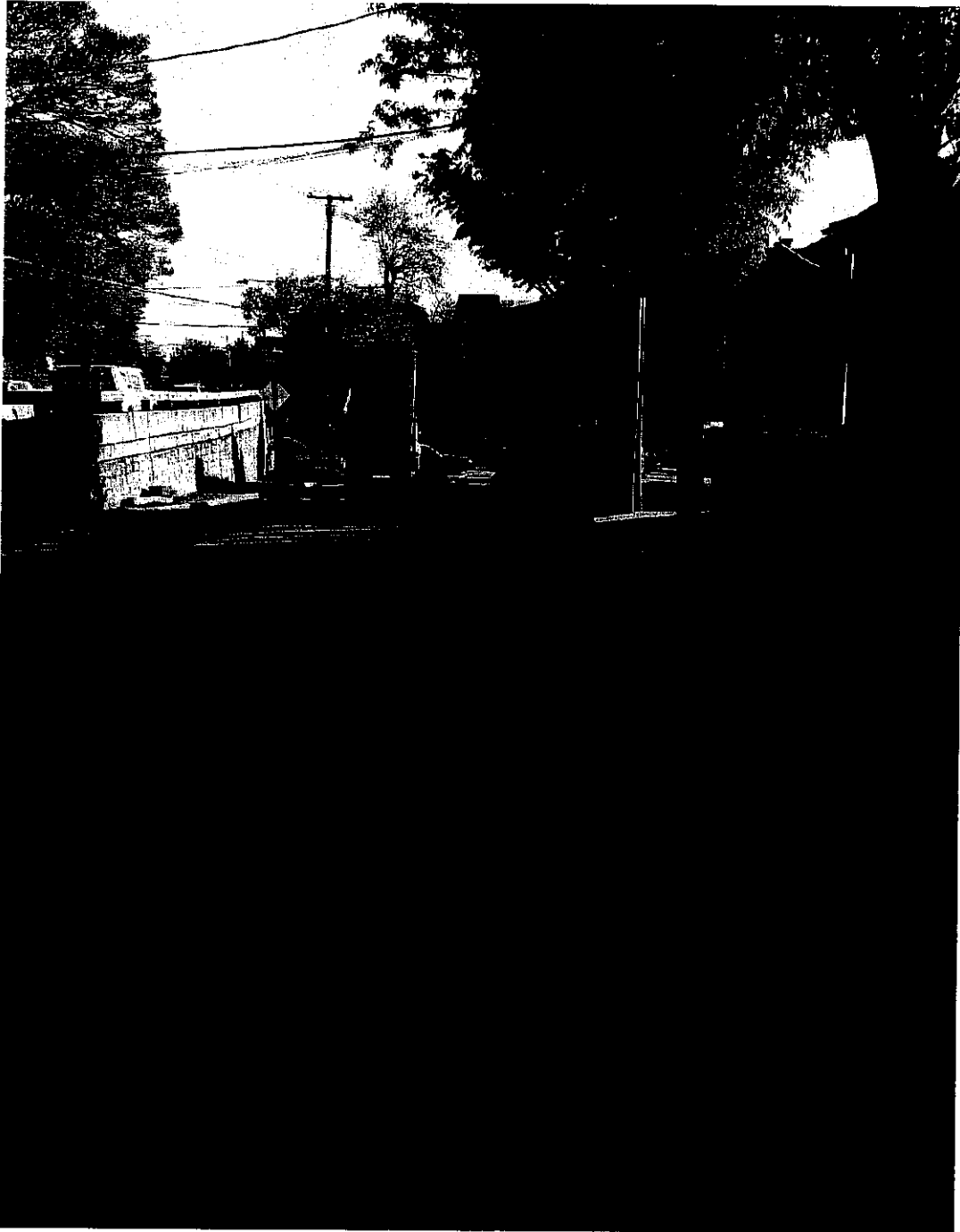

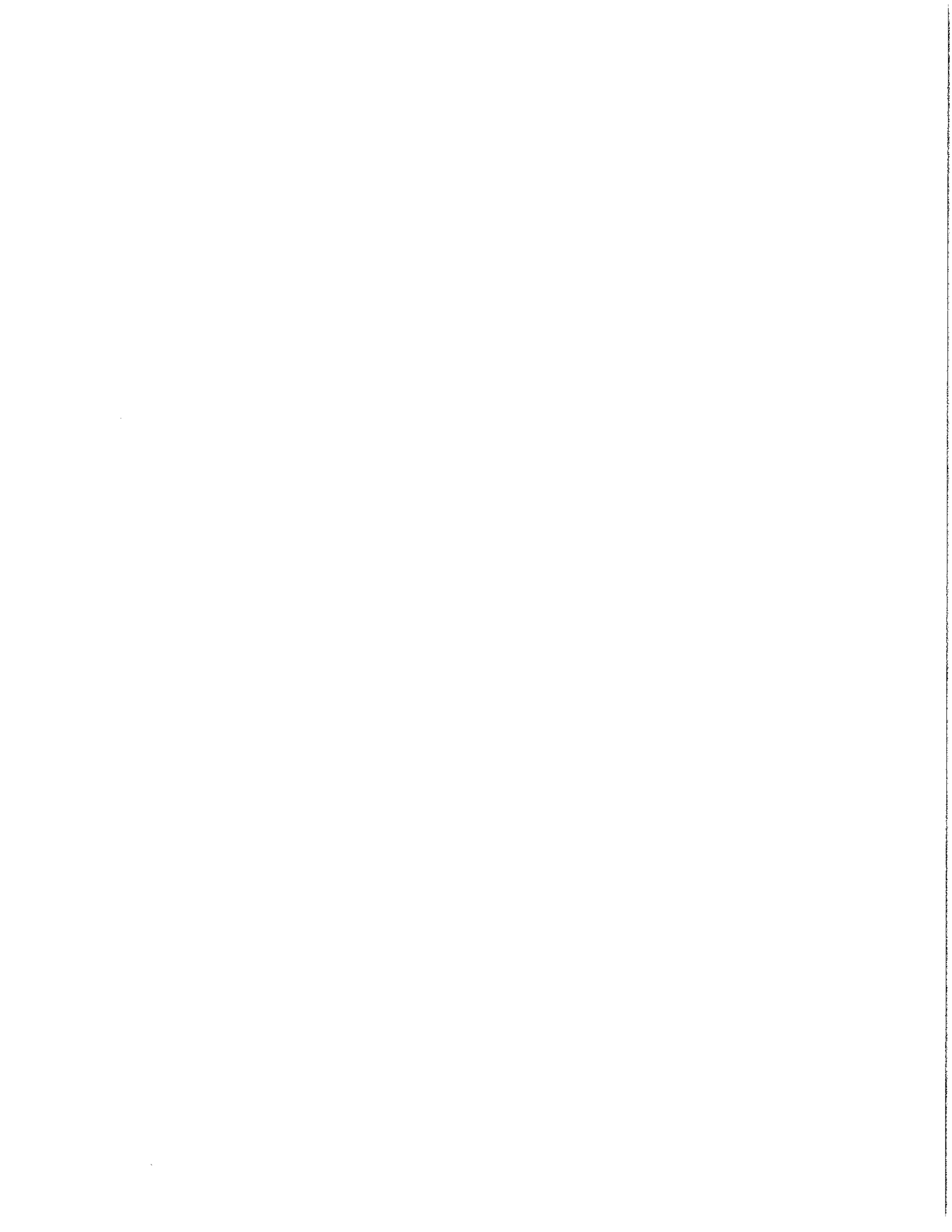

Inconveniences showed up with neighbors at the starting of the project, however, all problems were solved. Disturbed area was restored to original conditions, signs were placed where shown on plans and belgina block was added to second ramp due to difference of elevations. Furthermore, sidewalk width had to be changed from 5' to 4' due to the existing trees present at site. Finally, concrete was sealed with approved curing/sealer compound.

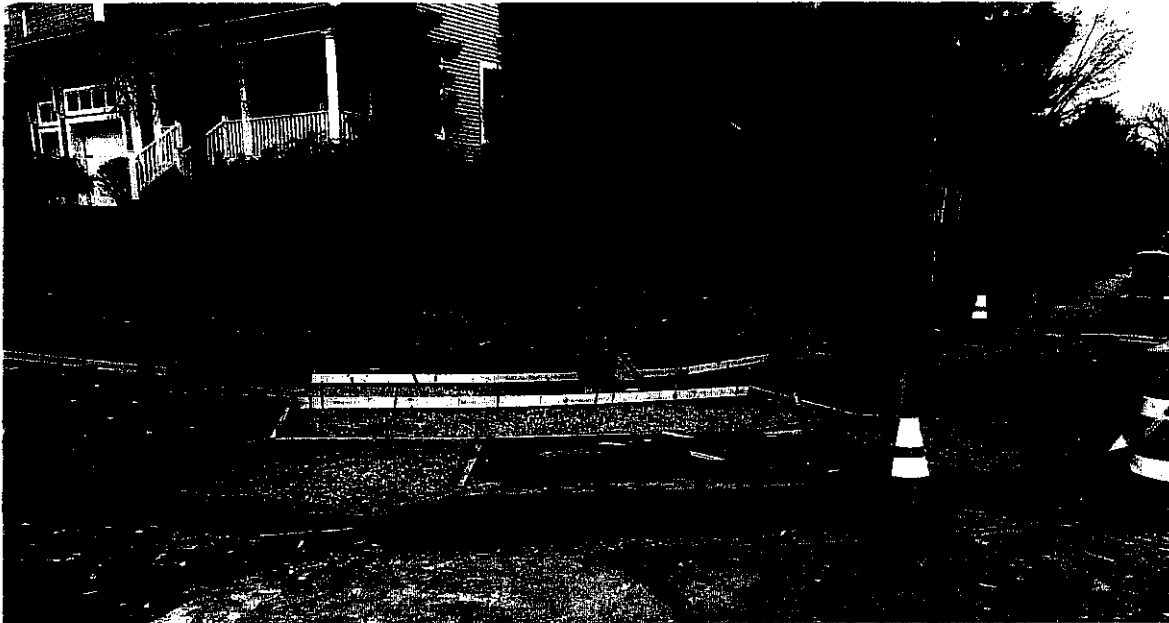

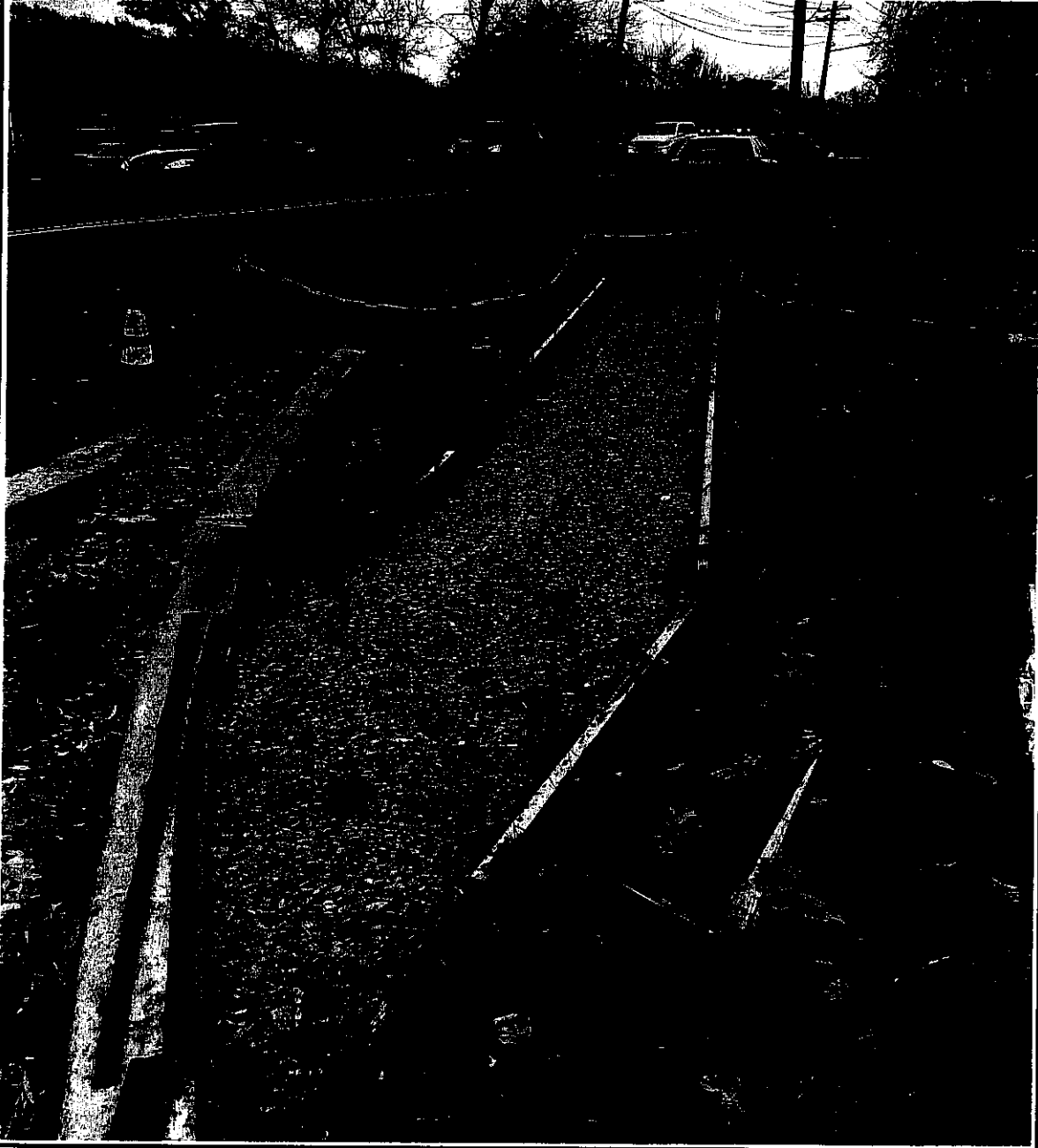

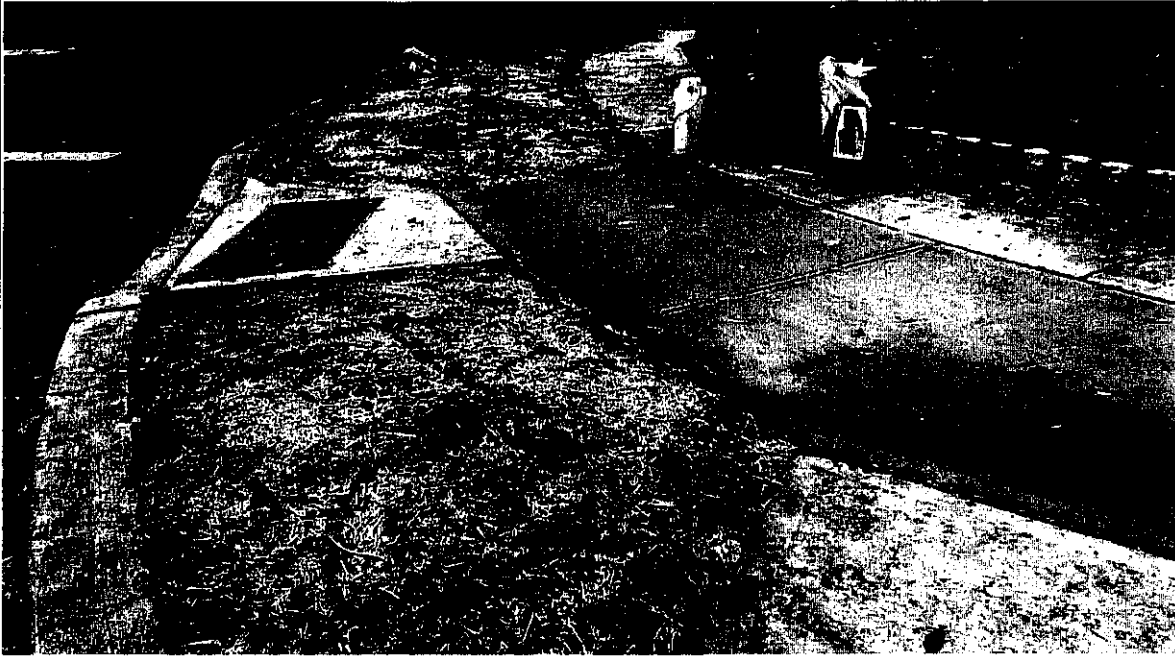

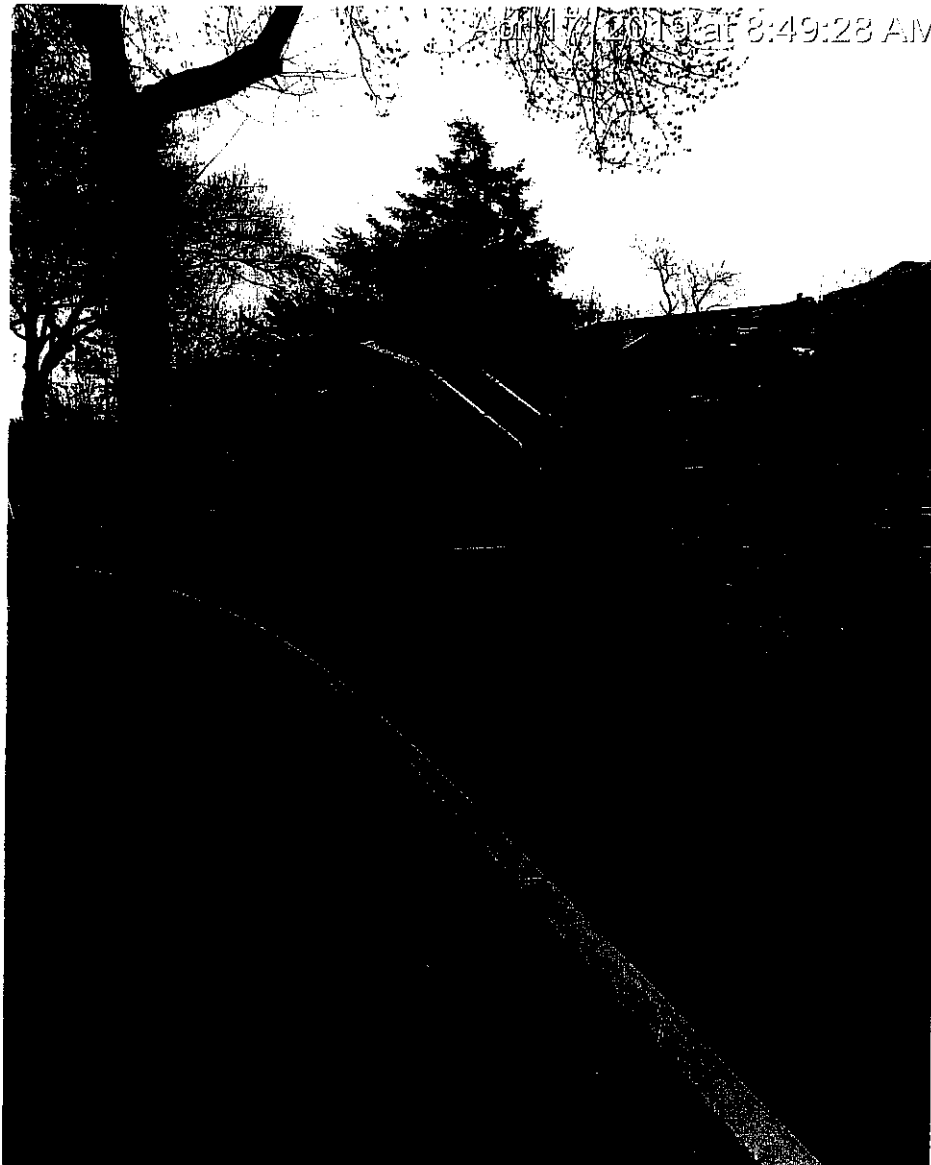

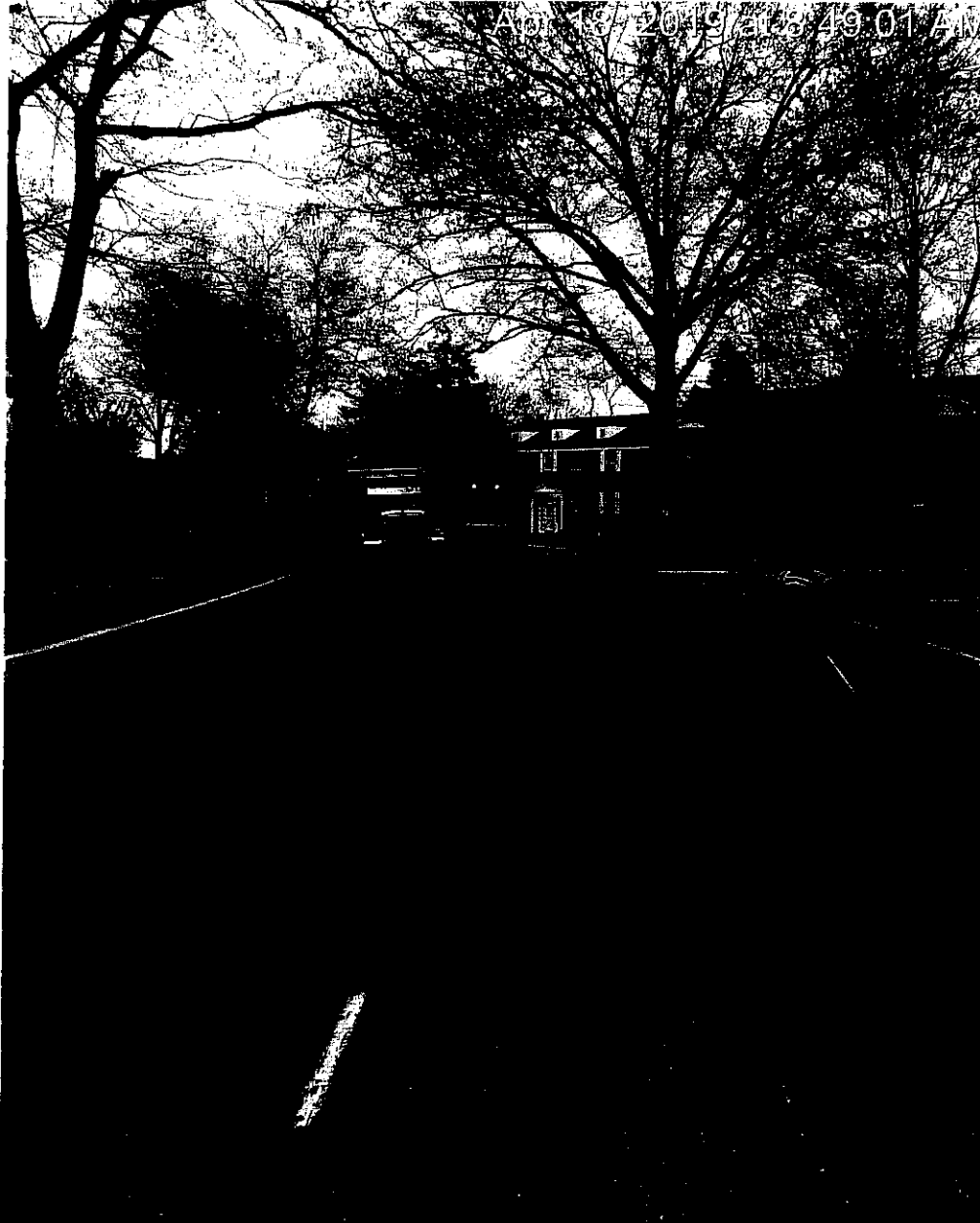

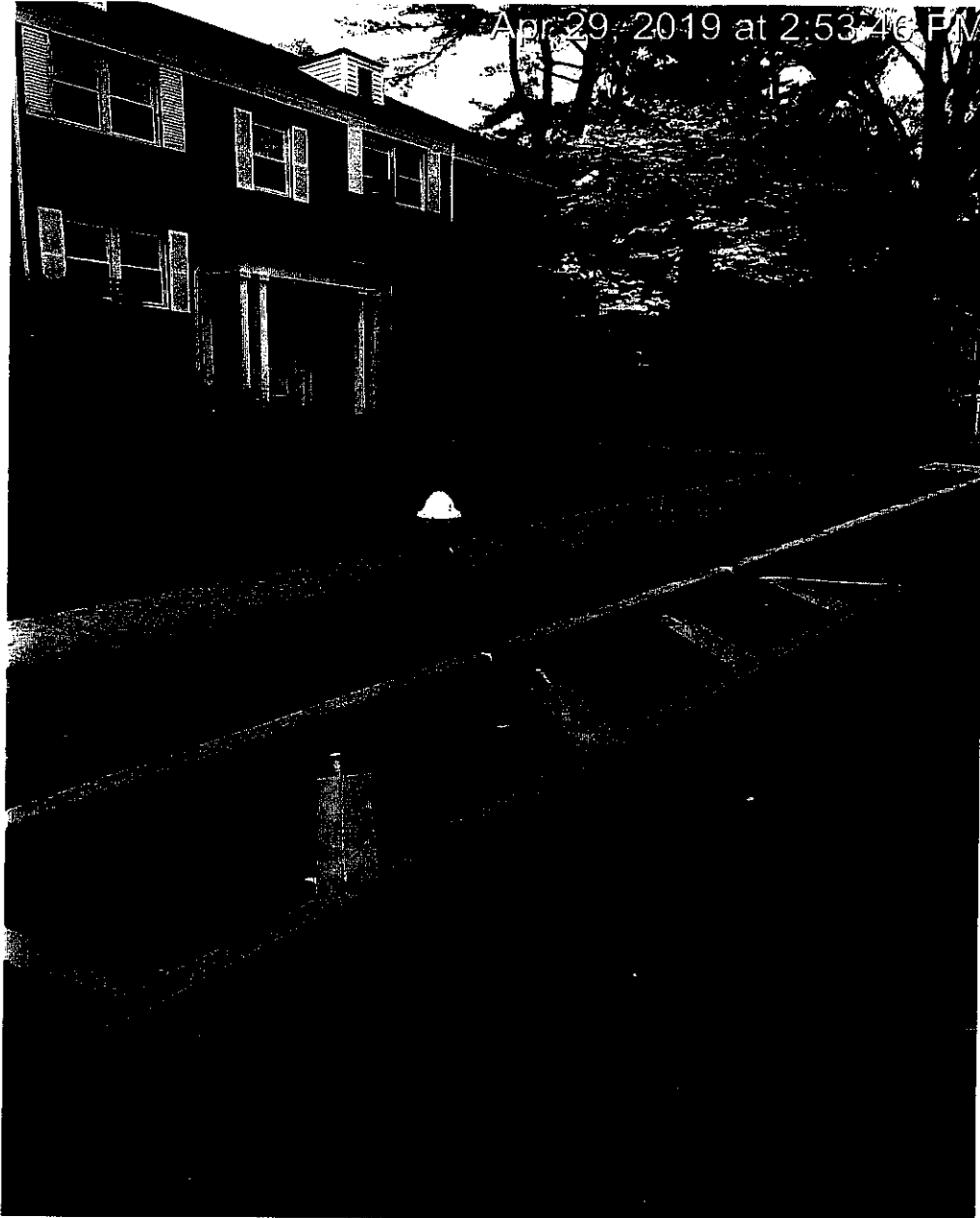

The borough has an electronic fleet inventory and maintenance management program that tracks repairs made to the vehicle and equipment. Vehicle maintenance is performed indoors. Waste oil and materials are properly disposed of or recycled. Non-chlorinated solvents and environmentally friendly products are used, if possible.

3. On-Site Equipment and Vehicle Washing

Vehicles are washed indoors at the Public Works Department. The Public Works Department has drainage system with an oil/water separator. If required, when vehicles are trucks) are used). Non-toxic and environmentally friendly car wash cleaning materials are used.

4. Discharge of Stormwater from Secondary Containment

The are no secondary containment tanks that discharge into storm water,

5. Salt and De-Icing Material Storage and Handling

RIVER EDGE PUBLIC WORKS – 500 Riverside Way, River Edge, NJ 07661
Salt is stored in a permanent concrete three side structure that has a roof and overhang that structure, The salt structure is inspected monthly to insure that no salt in outside of the structure. When receiving deliveries if salt, the salt is immediately pushed into the structure with a front-end loader.

6. Aggregate Material and Construction Debris Storage

Clean soil is stored on a stockpile located on a concrete pad. The spill is periodically removed and recycled at other construction site. Second grade stone is stored in a storage bin on top of an asphalt surface.

7. Street Sweepings, Catch Basin Clean Out and Other Material Storage

Street sweeping and catch basin cleanout debris are placed in a container / dumpster. These containers are changed and brought to market approximately every three days. The borough sweeps its roads and removes sweeping that are collected by the borough's garbage contractor.

8. Yard Trimmings and Wood Waste Management Sites

The borough hires a contractor to perform curbside collections of yard trimming. The trimmings are taken away and recycled off-site. There is also a storage area in the recycling center where yard and wood waste can be dropped off by residents. The yard and wood waste is then loaded weekly into containers and delivered to an off-site recycling facility.

9. Roadside Vegetation Management

The borough hires a contractor to perform curb side collection of yard trimmings. The trimmings are taken away and recycled off-site. In the Fall, the borough performs curb-side leaf collection. The leaves are loaded into a packer and vacuum trucks and delivered to the State licensed compost site.

Easy Things You Can Do Every Day To Protect Our Water

A Guide to Healthy Habits for Cleaner Water

Pollution on streets, parking lots and lawns is washed by rain into storm drains, then directly to our drinking water supplies and the ocean and lakes our children play in. Fertilizer, oil, pesticides, detergents, pet waste, grass clippings: You name it and it ends up in our water.

Stormwater pollution is one of New Jersey's greatest threats to clean and plentiful water, and that's why we're all doing something about it.

By sharing the responsibility and making small, easy changes in our daily lives, we can keep common pollutants out of stormwater. It all adds up to cleaner water, and it saves the high cost of cleaning up once it's dirty.

As part of New Jersey's initiative to keep our water clean and plentiful and to meet federal requirements, many municipalities and other public agencies including colleges and military bases must adopt ordinances or other rules prohibiting various activities that contribute to stormwater pollution. Breaking these rules can result in fines or other penalties.



As a resident, business, or other member of the New Jersey community, it is important to know these easy things you can do every day to protect our water.



Limit your use of fertilizers and pesticides

- Do a soil test to see if you need a fertilizer.
- Do not apply fertilizers if heavy rain is predicted.
- Look into alternatives for pesticides.
- Maintain a small lawn and keep the rest of your property or yard in a natural state with trees and other native vegetation that requires little or no fertilizer.
- If you use fertilizers and pesticides, follow the instructions on the label on how to correctly apply it.

Make sure you properly store or discard any unused portions.

Properly use and dispose of hazardous products

- Hazardous products include some household or commercial cleaning products, lawn and garden care products, motor oil, antifreeze, and paints.
- Do not pour any hazardous products down a storm drain because storm drains are usually connected to local waterbodies and the water is not treated.

- If you have hazardous products in your home or workplace, make sure you store or dispose of them properly. Read the label for guidance.

- Use natural or less toxic alternatives when possible.

- Recycle used motor oil.

- Contact your municipality, county or facility management office for the locations of hazardous-waste disposal facilities.



Keep pollution out of storm drains

- Municipalities and many other public agencies are required to mark certain storm drain inlets with messages reminding people that storm drains are connected to local waterbodies.

- Do not let sewage or other wastes flow into a stormwater system.

Clean up after your pet

- Many municipalities and public agencies must enact and enforce local pet-waste rules.

- An example is requiring pet owners or their keepers to pick up and properly dispose of pet waste dropped on public or other people's property.

- Make sure you know your town's or agency's requirements and comply with them. It's the law. And remember to:

- Use newspaper, bags or pooper-scoopers to pick up wastes.

- Dispose of the wrapped pet waste in the trash or unwrapped in a toilet.

- Never discard pet waste in a storm drain.



Don't litter

- Place litter in trash receptacles.

- Recycle. Recycle. Recycle.

- Participate in community cleanups.

Dispose of yard waste properly

- Keep leaves and grass out of storm drains.

- If your municipality or agency has yard waste collection rules, follow them.

- Use leaves and grass clippings as a resource for compost.

- Use a mulching mower that recycles grass clippings into the lawn.
