# **BOROUGH ADMINISTRATORS REPORT –**

<u>Raymond Poerio, Borough Administrator</u>-stated that over the past few months Council has gone ahead and introduced the budget. Since that point in time you've received a variety of different amendments that have been put together via our Finance Director or through different feedback that the Borough Administrator and CFO have received from Mayor and Council. He had included the additional amendments in their weekend packets of what they all are and what ultimately the new tax rate would be as well as all of the items that they've requested to be put into the capital ordinance. He had extended himself to the Mayor and Council for anyone who wanted to get together and it was recommended by one of the Councilman that we send the information to the Budget Advisory Committee which he did. What he is looking for from the Mayor and Council tonight is a direction from them whether they are satisfied with where the municipal budget and capital budget are at this point. If they are, he would like a straw poll to instruct him to go ahead with putting together the amended budget and the capital ordinance if they so desire.

<u>Councilwoman Busteed</u>-asked what the new tax increase is? It was \$93.00 when it was introduced. <u>Raymond Poerio</u>-stated that they were at \$93.00, they added \$26.52 to various things which brings it to \$119.52. Alan has warned him that it might change within .50 cents but Ray was sure that the Council would be okay with that. The capital ordinance should be self-explanatory. He also sent the Mayor and Council a memo on the budget proceedings going forward and said if they don't have any questions on that, we'll go ahead and publicize that and take the necessary steps to make people aware.

Councilman Papaleo-asked what percent per household would \$119.52 be?

Councilman Chinigo-said he thought it was 85%.

Councilman Papaleo-said no, no. What percent is the increase?

<u>Raymond Poerio</u>-said that he doesn't know the answer to that but he can get them the information.

On motion by Councilman Chinigo, seconded by Councilwoman Davis to give the Borough Administrator the direction to move forward with the municipal and capital budgets was unanimously approved.

<u>Councilwoman Busteed</u>-asked Ray if he wanted to comment on the changes he made in the format of the agenda?

1). All sponsorship proposals equal to or less than \$5,000 including creation of sublevels may be set and approved by the Borough Administrator. Proposals in excess of \$5,000 in material value are required to be approved by the governing body upon the recommendation of the Borough Administrator.

2. No program participant, Borough employee or official shall be required to participate in surveys or focus groups as a condition of any such sponsorship.

3. Such recognition in any manner shall not constitute the Borough's endorsement of any product, service or program provided by the sponsor.

4. All sponsorships shall be appropriate for audiences of all ages and shall not promote any illegal or discriminatory activity.

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## #19-164 Approval of Local Budget Review 2019 Budget

WHEREAS, N.J.S.A. 40A:78b has authorized the Local Finance Board to adopt rules that permit municipalities in sound fiscal condition to assume the responsibility, normally granted to the Director of the Division of Local Government Services, of conducting the annual budget examination; and

WHEREAS, N.J.A.C. 5:30-7 was adopted by the Local Finance Board on February 1997; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to N.J.A.C. 5:30-7.2 thru 7.5 the borough of River Edge has been declared eligible to participate in the program by the Division of Local Government Services, and the Chief Financial Officer has determined that the Borough meets the necessary conditions to participate in the program for the 2019 budget year.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Governing Body of the Borough of River Edge that in accordance with N.J.A.C. 5:30-7.6a & b and based upon the Chief Financial Officers certification, the Governing Body has found the budget has met the following requirements:

- 1. That with reference to the following items, the amounts have been calculated pursuant to the law and appropriated as such in the budget:
  - a. Payment of interest and debt redemption charges
  - b. Deferred charges and statutory expenditures
  - c. Cash deficit of preceding year
  - d. Reserve for uncollected taxes
  - e. Other reserves and non-disbursement items
  - f. Any inclusions of amounts required for school purposes
- 2. That the provisions relating to limitation on the Property Tax Levy, Chapter 62, Public Laws of 2007 and to a limitation on increases of appropriations pursuant to <u>N.J.S.A.</u> 40A:4-45.2 and the appropriations for exceptions to limits on appropriations found at 40A:4-453 et seq. are fully met (Complies with the "CAP" law.)
- 3. That the budget is in such form, arrangement and content as required by the Local Budget Law and <u>N.J.A.C.</u> 5:30-4 and 5:30-5.
- 4. That pursuant to the Local Budget Law:
  - a. All estimates of revenue are reasonable, accurate and correctly stated,
  - b. Items of appropriation are properly set forth,

c. In itemization, form, arrangement and content the budget will permit the exercise of the comptroller function within the municipality.

- 5. The budget and associated amendments have been introduced, publicly advertised and in accordance with the relevant provisions of the Local Budget Law, except that failure to meet the deadlines of <u>N.J.S.A.</u> 40A:4-5 shall not prevent such certification.
- 6. That all other applicable statutory requirements have been fulfilled.

He mentioned that all of the phones in the Borough should have a caller I.D. and would like us to move forward in making that happen.

Councilwoman Busteed-are you saying that incoming calls need to be identified?

Councilman Gautier-replied, yes. He wished everyone a Happy Earth Day.

<u>Councilwoman Davis</u>-reported that the Alliance meeting that was supposed to be tomorrow night has been cancelled and the next meeting will be with the schools on May 15<sup>th</sup>. She congratulated Sergeant Griffith and Police Officer Piterski for the awards that they received for DWI Enforcement for 2018. She also congratulated our Shade Tree Commission for recognition as 2018 Tree City USA. She reported that the Ambulance Corp. had 57 calls in April; 39 medical, 8 traumas, 2 MVA's, 2 psychs, 3 allergic reactions and 3 fire calls. So far they've had 203 calls. There's a little issue that they're trying work out mainly with Paramus. They went to Paramus 7 times, Oradell 5 and New Milford 3. What happened, Paramus put out for a call at 2 - 2:30 a.m. and when two of our members called in they were told that another town took it. When checking it out, we found out that they put in several calls and whoever shows up first gets it. She feels that it's not such a nice thing at 2:30 in the morning so she suggested that they have a conversation with them.

<u>Councilman Chinigo</u>-also congratulated Shade Tree for Tree City USA and Sergeant Griffith and Officer Piterski for being recognized for outstanding and distinguished service to River Edge. He reported that he is working on "Coffee with a Cop" with Chief Cariddi and hopes to have something set up by next month or so. He has heard that the Car Show is back on and is glad that they've resolved the issues. He thanked Little League for inviting them to opening day and especially all of the volunteers who helped get the fields in shape that day. He also reported that we have a big weekend coming up in River Edge with the 5 K Run on Saturday and looks forward to seeing everyone there.

<u>Councilwoman Busteed</u>-said that Carolyn Baldanza asked her to remind the Mayor and Council and the public about the River Edge Run on Saturday. Although she will be away with the Girl Scouts, she hopes that the weather will be beautiful. With regard to Earth Day, she wanted to take a moment to remind the public of the work that the Borough has done this year to improve opportunities for our residents to recycle, reduce and reuse. Whether it was Recycle Coach, which Councilman Chinigo

WHEREAS, pursuant to N.J.A.C. 5:30-7.2 thru 7.5 the borough of River Edge has been declared eligible to participate in the program by the Division of Local Government Services, and the Chief Financial Officer has determined that the Borough meets the necessary conditions to participate in the program for the 2019 budget year.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Governing Body of the Borough of River Edge that in accordance with N.J.A.C. 5:30-7.6a & b and based upon the Chief Financial Officers certification, the Governing Body has found the budget has met the following requirements:

- 1. That with reference to the following items, the amounts have been calculated pursuant to the law and appropriated as such in the budget:
  - a. Payment of interest and debt redemption charges
  - b. Deferred charges and statutory expenditures
  - c. Cash deficit of preceding year
  - d. Reserve for uncollected taxes
  - e. Other reserves and non-disbursement items
  - f. Any inclusions of amounts required for school purposes
- 2. That the provisions relating to limitation on the Property Tax Levy, Chapter 62, Public Laws of 2007 and to a limitation on increases of appropriations pursuant to <u>N.J.S.A.</u> 40A:4-45.2 and the appropriations for exceptions to limits on appropriations found at 40A:4-453 et seq. are fully met (Complies with the "CAP" law.)
- 3. That the budget is in such form, arrangement and content as required by the Local Budget Law and <u>N.J.A.C.</u> 5:30-4 and 5:30-5.
- 4. That pursuant to the Local Budget Law:
  - a. All estimates of revenue are reasonable, accurate and correctly stated,
  - b. Items of appropriation are properly set forth,
  - c. In itemization, form, arrangement and content the budget will permit the exercise of the comptroller function within the municipality.
- The budget and associated amendments have been introduced, publicly advertised and in accordance with the relevant provisions of the Local Budget Law, except that failure to meet the deadlines of <u>N.J.S.A.</u> 40A:4-5 shall not prevent such certification.
- 6. That all other applicable statutory requirements have been fulfilled.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that a copy of this resolution be forwarded to the Director of the Division of Local Government Services.
